NODA Summer School – what a blast!



For some, holidays are about luxuriating by a pool and sipping a pina colada, for others it's climbing mountains or visiting historical sites – for me it's spending a week up north with a bunch of luvvies who love to learn, laugh and play!

Every year, NODA (the membership organisation for amateur theatre) organises a Summer School, attended by nearly 200 people from all over the UK and led by a highly talented group of professional theatre practitioners. We gather at the Yarnfield Conference Centre in Stone, Staffordshire and we each spend

a week on different courses, revisiting and learning new skills in all aspects of theatre. Over the years I have completed courses in Epic Theatre, Comedy, Directing, Mask, Mime and Puppetry, Adapting Novels for Stage and Movie Making. This year I spent a joyful week on the Ensemble, Ease and Excellence Course led by Grace Goulding, a professional movement director and choreographer. Wow! Her energy, knowledge and teaching style was phenomenal and inspiring.

My fellow students were a fun-loving, bonkers bunch – I had definitely found my "tribe!" We spent a week on ensemble work, learning how to invigorate and enliven group and chorus elements of theatre. Without the pressures and normal restraints of a production, we had the luxury of being able to relax, explore, create, experiment, practise, revise and reflect.

And this is what makes NODA Summer School one of the highlights of my year – not only learning from professional theatre practitioners who are in touch with current trends, theories and ideas, but also fellow amdrum friends who have years of experience, knowledge and resources. As well as our classes, many conversations over dinner, breaks, evening workshops or socials were full of mind-buzzing possibilities to take home to our societies. I came away with renewed

energy, ideas and the confidence to trust and make bold choices on stage. I'm looking forward to my next directorial escapade!
